- Since its January installation, the geotube system has stopped erosion at the toe of the bank; if completed with the engineer recommended 4th tier of geotubes, the potential exists for long -term protection in the face of rising sea levels.
- "Best practices" environmental design avoids harming nearby beaches through sand cover and regular replenishment.
- Monitoring measures impact for miles in each direction, with funds in escrow to assure removal if negative impacts occur.
- Beach users have full access even during storm tides. The wide summer beach shows no negative impact from the geotube system.
- Coastal engineers and the State DEP agree that the alternative "jute bag" approach will not withstand major storms.
